Note that if you do not reach 72 patient contact/experiential hours, the grade for that assignment will be reduced by 5 points for each hour missed. If you do not reach 24 administrative hours, the grade will be reduced by 3 points for each hour missed. If you have extenuating circumstances that prohibit you from reaching these hours, please discuss this with your instructor/s as soon as you recognize an issue.
