COURSE DESCRIPTION

Introduction to Music Theory Rudiments provides students with a theoretical foundation essential to advance through future courses in theory, aural training, and other related fields of expertise. Topics included in this rudimentary course covers basic elements such as notation, pitch, rhythm, meter, scales, intervals, chords, keyboard, and aural skills.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this course, students will develop the following competency:

- Understand and memorize music rudiments
- Properly notate music
- Apply music rudiments effectively in the chosen area of expertise and higher-level courses in theory and practice

ASSIGNMENTS

Assignments will be given regularly in every chapter to review important concepts. The due date for each assignment will primarily take place after finishing a chapter. Late submission can be only accepted during a given timeframe for each assignment. Ten percent of points will also be taken off for late submission.

EXAMS

Multiple categories of exam will be given as part of completing this course:

<u>Rudimentary Tests</u>: Three tests will occur roughly every 5 weeks to evaluate the understanding of students on concepts and subjects relevant to that period. These tests will take place during class time and last for 45 minutes each.

<u>Aural Skills Tests</u>: These tests will examine the students' ability in identifying rudimentary elements and transcribe them in the forms of singing and notational writing. Two types of these tests, including Sight-singing and Dictation, will be performed during class time, except for Dictation test 2, which will be a take-home test.

<u>Final Exam</u>: taking place on December 9th, the final exam evaluates the students' knowledge on all music rudiments introduced through the entire semester. This is a two-hour exam to be done in class.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance is a critical component to the comprehension of concepts, and a portion of the final grade. For the optimum outcome of this course, it is expected that students make efforts to attend classes and participate in the learning environment. Two unexcused absences will result in having the final grade decreased by one grade category. Attending class late by 15 minutes or more is also automatically considered an unexcused absence.
