<u>Course Description:</u> Conducting 1 is an introduction to basic conducting concepts focusing on the relationship of gesture to sound, acquisition of basic conducting techniques, and the fundamentals of score reading and score preparation.

Learning Objectives:

The student conductor will:

- Demonstrate appropriate conducting posture and hand/baton positions
- Demonstrate adequate skill in basic gestural techniques
- Demonstrate appropriate score study/score preparation habits through use of piano and part-singing
- Demonstrate adequate skill in conducting historically appropriate performances through adequate score preparation

- Demonstrate ability to appropriately assess conducting performances
- Exhibit knowledge of basic conducting terminology

Private Conducting Lessons: You will each be assigned a Conducting Mentor. That person will arrange a mutually agreed upon 10-minute (weekly) private lesson with you. Attendance at these lessons is required and <u>will</u> count toward your class attendance. These lesson times are for you to receive feedback on your conducting skills in preparation for your in-class conduction sessions, as well as to work on the material presented in the six (6) Conducting Gesture Quizzes.

Learning Activities to meet the Objectives:

Conducting Gesture Quizzes (6)

[10 points each, total: 60 points]

The Conducting Gesture Quizzes will assess the student's ability to demonstrate:

- 1. Basic patterns, prep, beats and cut-offs *Due 9/5/24 by 11:59pm*
- 2. Basic articulations and dynamic changes *Due 9/19/24 by 11:59pm*
- 3. Accents and gesture of syncopation *Due 10/3/24 by 11:59pm*
- 4. Subdivision *Due 10/17/24 by 11:59pm*
- 5. Fermatas *Due 10/31/24 by 11:59pm*
- 6. Use of left hand *Due 11/14/24 by 11:59pm*

Students will video record themselves performing the assessments and upload the video to the appropriate assignment page in Canvas <u>before 11:59pm on the due date</u>. Be advised: large video files might take a while to upload. Please leave yourself enough time to trouble-shoot and/or contact the UF Computing Help Desk with upload issues. <u>Late electronic submissions will not receive credit.</u> **In order to receive credit, each quizzes recording must be 1 continuous "take" (i.e. do not stop and restart recording between each line of the quiz).

Classroom Participation

[25 points]

Each student will be assigned a total of four (4) in-class conducting sessions. The student is responsible for obtaining an adequate audio/video recording of his/her conducting session.

In addition, each student will be expected to prepare **ALL** pieces covered during the course. Each student will adequately prepare his/her vocal line **AND** be able to conduct the ensemble through the piece.

Conducting Self-Assessments (4)

[10 points each, total: 40 points]

The student will complete a Conductor's Self-Assessment Form (provided in Canvas) following each of his/her 4 assigned in-class conducting sessions. The student will be assessed on the quality and quantity of his/her reflections in each of the assessment subcategories. *Must be uploaded to Canvas no later than 12:35pm THE DAY AFTER YOUR CONDUCTING SESSION.* Late electronic submissions will not receive credit.

I highly suggest you submit your first video assignment on the earlier side to have plenty of time to troubleshoot potential issues. PRO TIP: Don't start your upload and go to sleep expecting it to fully upload. Always confirm that the submission was complete <u>before</u> the deadline. If you encounter problems, contact the UF Computing Help Desk IN ADVANCE of the deadline.
- Conducting Private Lesson appointments with your Assigned TA will count toward the attendance record.
- Two tardy days = one absence.
