# University of Florida School of Music MUL6555 – Survey of Wind Literature Spring 2025 (W Periods 3-4)

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**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** The seminar examines the history and development of literature for chamber and larger ensembles of mixed wind and percussion instruments from the Baroque Period to present.

#### **LEARNING OBJECTIVES:**

- 1. To be able to identify, audibly and by score identification, the masterworks for winds. \*Listening should always be accompanied by score reading.
- 2. To be able to discuss the assigned works in-depth (historically, theoretically, etc.)
- 3. To be able to identify specific style characteristics of the music time periods, the relevant master composers, and cite details of those composers' lives.
- 4. To develop informed opinions on what constitutes wind music of high artistic merit.

**EXAMINATIONS:** There will be two (2) exams: a Midterm and a Final. They will be identical in format

# Part 1: Listening (50%)

10 listening excerpts from the provided listening lists.

The student will identify the composer, title of piece, and movement (when applicable). 1 point will be earned for each correct answer

ex: A) Mozart, B) Serenade No. 10, C) 3<sup>rd</sup> Movement = **3 points** 

\*\*The student must correctly identify the composer to be eligible to earn points for the title. Similarly, the student must correctly identify the title to be eligible to earn points for the movement.

# Part 2: Essays (50%)

The student will write two brief essays to be assigned (by the instructor) from a list of 6 provided prompts.
