### **Course Description**

Oboe Pedagogy will engage students in a thorough review of materials available for oboe that are useful in a teaching and studio setting. Students will discover, analyze and review a variety of materials that are appropriate for students at all ages and ability levels.

### **Course Objectives**

By the end of this course, students will have a broad and thorough understanding of teaching methods, literature, and other resources as they relate to teaching the oboe. Students will learn how to apply relevant materials to effectively solve a myriad of problems that they may experience in teaching settings, communicate their objectives clearly and effectively, and think critically about how to deliver this content.

### **Required texts and materials:**

Materials will be assigned on a weekly basis from a wide range of sources, including free resources on the internet, materials in the possession of the UF oboe studio, and resources available to students through the UF library system.
